Covid-19 shutdown and reopening:

Congratulations go to the Covid-19 Reopening Committee chaired by SAL Commander Tom Barto. This team's efforts have allowed us to stay open and we had no issues during a no-notice Liquor Authority visit. On July 23rd an investigator visited the Post and complimented our setup with proper separation both inside and outside, as well he said that he witnessed no violations on face mask wearing. He also said that they waited in the parking lot for a bit and noticed that people were putting masks on in order to go in and said that we were complying satisfactorily.

This has not been an easy task for the Committee as we have had to police our own members to maintain our compliance. One violation could cost us a fine or shut down, which would negatively affect our post.

A big thank you goes to the Re-opening Committee for keeping us up to date and compliant with requirements, and a thank you for the extensive hours that Tom himself has put into the successful re-opening of our Post. Please help Tom and I support the bartenders in maintaining compliance to the Covid-19 requirements. Your peer support while in the Post will help maintain our compliance and keep us in operation.

While we were shut down many people were still working behind the scenes to keep us financially safe and operationally ready for reopening:

- Treasurer Gerry McDonald was in regularly to keep our bills paid, working with the bank to file applications for Pay Protection Program (PPP) and Small Business Administration (SBA) loans / grants. The PPP loan was received, and we were able to continue pay to those employees who qualified and have worked through the funds and are applying for forgiveness. The rules to this program have been constantly changing and Gerry has kept us compliant. Kudos to Gerry for being the man behind the curtain keeping our organization financially upright.
- Bob Perkins provides our cleaning / maintenance, and he has been stopping in periodically to do checks on the building for security and maintenance, which is much appreciated has been as items have come up that need addressing even though we were not in operation. He was instrumental in supporting the Reopening Committee and assisting in obtaining a replacement freezer.
- Val volunteered to come in and spent hours cleaning the bar and taking physical inventory of all products that we have on hand. She missed the Post and was bored, so we found a way!
- The Bar Operations Assessment Team (BOAT Committee) Chaired by Rick Stirpe has loaded all inventory into the new Point of Sale (POS) program and learned what its capabilities are. We were only using a portion of the system's capability. Rick will be the Inventory Manager, an ongoing position to maintain our inventory control for accuracy and Strategic Sourcing. The BOAT Committee has learned a lot about what we need to work on to optimize inventory control, purchasing practices, and streamlining product selection. Thanks to Rick for taking the lead on this Committee; it will be the main project of our cost reduction efforts in 2020.
- The shutdown of meat processing plants due to the pandemic caused a supply chain interruption in the nation's meat availability, as can be seen on current meat prices at the store. Our community outreach partnering with Stierly Farms earlier in the year for the February meat raffle provided us an inside option of forward-purchasing beef that will be available in the fall. The Post Officers have unanimously voted to pre-purchase a ½ beef, which will be ~300 pounds available at the beginning of November. We have done this to secure food for our membership, where, in the event that the projected interruption occurs, we will have a supply of meat to sell to our membership at lower than market prices as well as hold an epic meat raffle this fall! This is our Leadership being forward looking for the benefit of our membership during this uncertain time.
- Jason Brown reached out to the Red Cross and coordinated a blood drive at the Post on May 20th that received 14 blood donations, which is twice what we normally would receive. Nice job, Jason!
- Marty Wheaton and John Cunningham took the first couple weeks of shutdown to do extensive maintenance on the gaming machines and to empty years of used tickets out of the shed. The sheds are now organized where we only keep the required one year's worth of used games on hand for audit. A positive side effect of this was that we also evaluated and switched shredding suppliers that should save ~\$750 per year in disposal costs.
- One of our members approached me with a proposal to utilize his landscaping company for our grounds maintenance at ½ the cost of the existing provider in exchange for storing his lawn equipment trailer in the overflow lot for the season. His company has provided proper insurance coverage and this should be a ~\$650 savings for the season. Thanks for stepping up and providing service at a cost savings to the Post, Paul!

- Funds have been earmarked to purchase the overflow parking lot from the current investors of JPE Properties. We are waiting for the paperwork to be processed so we can purchase the lot as part of the Memorial Club property if it is re-zoned to Commercial.
- Dick Naylor, David Huber, and Mike Cunningham completed the Post Nomination Committee activities and have submitted recommendations for the 2020-2021 year. National issued an executive order in May suspending Officer voting for all Legion organizations, including the SAL and AUX, stating that all existing 2019-2020 Officers are to remain in office for the 2020-2021 term. Happily, this does not adversely affect our organization as significant changes were not expected for this term. For the Post, I have appointed Russell Miller as 1st Vice Commander and David Huber as Sergeant-at-Arms for the remaining term as these positions were vacant and they have volunteered to assume the positions. Finally, the light at the end of my Commander tunnel is no longer an oncoming train as Russ will be mirroring in the 1st VC position with the intent to assume Commander in 2021. Thank you, Russ!!!
- Russ Miller coordinated with local city leadership keeping tabs on PAUSE requirements to be in compliance for Memorial Day and, unfortunately, had to cancel a public ceremony. He did, however, manage to find a way to safely coordinate volunteer organizations to remotely support our cemeteries for flag replacement and held properly socially distanced independent flag teams in conjunction with Frank Williamee to honor our deceased veterans. Well done.
- Prior to shutdown we had come to an agreement with the small family owned C&J Eatery, LLC to lease the kitchen three days a week to provide food for outside services as well as for members in the lounge (including starting up Friday fish fries again!). After Labor Day weekend they will be operating Wed, Thurs, and Fri and will have a menu for the bar patrons as well as doing take away sales. This has been a successful endeavor and our members have raved about the fish fries and are eagerly awaiting the other menu items.

The mission of the Ritual Team Honor Guard is to provide full military honors for our fallen brothers and sisters. The significance of this mission has not diminished over time, and we are duty bound to fulfill our obligations. The Honor Guard is comprised of over 18 members and each member is outfitted at a cost of \$800 per uniform to the Ritual Team. As you can see from the list above, the unit provided military honors to over 70 individuals - even with a 2 month interruption due to COVID-19.

We have a key group of 4 or 5 individual that schedule events, maintain equipment, perform ceremonies and train the squad. This group also performs the majority of the 72 events above with little or no additional support from other members. This is no small undertaking! We have a regional reputation of being one of the premier units in the area. We need the continued support of those who participate regularly, and we need as much additional support from those members that have uniforms but for whatever reason have not been able to participate.

We need your help! We have relied on a core group of senior Honor Guard members that do most of the heavy lifting on a daily basis to ensure this program continues. Let's thank them by stepping up, honoring their commitment, and put on a uniform. We all have commitments to work and family. I am asking you to remember the commitment you made to the Legion when you put on the uniform of our Honor Guard. We will be delighted if you can manage even one more event in the coming months.







Bar Sales and Inventory – by Rick Stirpe

Inventory control is a position with cold, hard facts and figures. I would like to go beyond that and let our membership know exactly what we are doing behind the data to turn things around in our club. I believe that many of you have noticed some subtle changes since our re-opening as far as products that we carry (or don't carry), some drink specials and some of you have even noticed that we have run out of product from time-to-time.

The whole process of change started with the BOAT Committee (Bar Operations Assessment Team) which incorporated all the previous year's supplier invoices into a spreadsheet so that our expenditures could be analyzed. (Right here I've got to give kudos to Mason Jensen for the many hours he spent transcribing copies of invoices into a spreadsheet). After review we found that weekly delivery charges could be cut by ordering monthly, ordering liquor by the case or half-case can save as much as 30% and, it was found that we had many products that were underpriced – some selling below what we paid for them. There was no way we could raise the price of some products at the time of reopening even though we were taking a loss. We also found that some products we had in stock were not selling or may never sell.

So, what you all have noticed are the "Drink Specials" signs. These "specials" have helped us liquidate non-selling, slow-selling and money losing products. I'm sure you all realize that we had some non-selling products on the "specials" list and understand why they were there. But there were a couple of products on the list that may have made you wonder "why are they selling this so cheap?" Well, these were products that we were selling at cost or slightly above. We had a draft beer and a bottled IPA that was selling for \$3.50 and should have been selling for \$5.50. We would have been chastised for raising the price \$2/drink, so we got rid of them. We will try and come up with alternatives, but we feel that it would be in our members best interests to keep beer prices at or below \$4/drink. More "specials" will be forthcoming.

Those of you who have noticed that we have run out of product from time-to-time, I understand how frustrating it can be to come in and order your favorite brew only to find that we are "out until Tuesday". Let me explain. We have been in the planning stages for quite some time to switch from bottled beer to canned beer but have been hesitant to do so as we understand that many bottled beer drinkers are adamant in holding onto their traditional bottled brews. But canned beer products constitute a considerable savings over bottled beers. We felt that after the shutdown our membership would understand that we would have to take steps to save the club as much money as possible going forward. So, we have run our stock down to a minimum to prepare for the switch. That has presented some problems as the distributors have been in short supply of various products almost weekly and there has recently been an aluminum can shortage. We anticipate shortages to be short-lived and as soon as manufacturing/supply catches up with demand, you can expect canned beer to be stocked and sold at the club.

Finally, you will notice that some of our snack food items such as potato chips will increase in price slightly, and cheese/pepperoni may increase slightly as well. We found that the market prices for cheese and pepperoni varies monthly and we will no longer be able to post a set price. The prices we post will be for the current purchased lot and they may change when we buy the next time.

Thanks for your patience during these trying times. Our goal is to make a li
